Over half term, you have the opportunity to create anything from the list below, in preparation for our Jubilee Street party after half term –



- A crown to wear on the day

I really enjoyed our final art session this half term, and seeing some of the children's cubist drawings come to life, here are some examples (not all are finished!!)


