


Letter from Mrs Huish 04.10.23

How has your child settled into their new academic year? Come and find out! We have two opportunities for you to find out about your child's learning.

If you have two or more children at Dartington Academy, you will need to do this for each one. The consultations will be face to face, but if you would prefer a telephone call, please let us know and the teacher will call you in that slot instead.

Community News: Donation of Playtime Equipment

Community News: We Need Your Help for School Funding

What is Census Day?

This is an important day for the school because the DFE calculate the school funding on this day. They allocate a budget based on two criteria:

- The number of children who attend the school that day
- The number of children (in EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2) who have a school dinner on that day We can win £750 for the school if we have the highest attendance on Thursday!


What happens if my child is not in school or does not have a school lunch?

If your child is absent from school and does not have a school lunch, in KS1 and EYFS, the school does not receive funding for your child. For example, if 20 children are off and do not have a school lunch, the school would not be funded for those 20 children which would be over £80,000 of lost funds.

What is happening on this day?

All children on this day will be provided with a special Census school lunch designed by one of our Trust pupils from our recent competition that all children entered. We are delighted to announce that our school winner, Lottie Mae, also won the Hub menu and reached the final stage. Well done Lottie Mae! The winning menu for the Trust that will be prepared by our kitchens and served on Census Day – 5th October was from
