<p>This week in maths, we have been practising subitising one, two, three and four. There is not always a clear answer: some objects contain many numbers. For example, you may see one button and another person might see and subitise the four threading holes. I wonder what numbers you can find in the objects around you?</p>	<p>Please complete the 'sound of the day' sheet with your child.
