<p>This week in maths, we have been practising subitising one, two, three and four. There is not always a clear answer: some objects contain many numbers. For example, you may see one button and another person might see and subitise the four threading holes. I wonder what numbers you can find in the objects around you?</p>	<p>Please complete the 'sound of the day' sheet with your child. We will have already introduced this sound during the school day and it is a lovely opportunity for your child to share their learning with you at home.</p>	<p>Read your phonics/library book or something you enjoy each night (even if it is just a page!)</p> <p>Remember, we give certificates for every 10, 25, 50, and 75 books read!</p>
