This week in maths, we have been looking at explaining our answers and reasoning. For example, if there are 4 gloves, we can say 'I know there are 4 because I can see 2 and another 2'. I wonder if you can find and explain any numbers around your house?	Please complete the 'sound of the day' or Ditty reading sheet with your child. We will have already introduced this sound/ ditty during the school day and it is a lovely opportunity for your child to share their learning with you at home.
