Then, we used our maths knowledge to fill the gap with the correct number of items. I wonder if you can make some number cards (less than 20) and try this at home?</p>	<p>Using some of the words in your R.W.Inc book, ditty sheet or CVC words, I wonder if your adult can test your Fred Finger spellings?
