<p>This week in our maths work, we have been practising our counting of objects accurately. If you have anything that needs counting at home, can you ask to count them (within reason). For example: 'How many pieces of fruit are left in the bowl?' or 'How many toys are in the toy basket?'</p>	<p>Using some of the words in your R.W.Inc book, ditty sheet or CVC words, I wonder if your adult can test your Fred Finger spellings?
