<p>This week in our maths work, we have continued to look at 3D shapes, recalling their names and talking about their 'faces'. We looked at cubes, cones, pyramids, spheres and cuboids. I wonder if you can spot any and recall think about how many faces they have?</p>	<p>Using some of the words in your R.W.Inc book, ditty sheet or CVC words, I wonder if your adult can test your Fred Finger spellings?
