Can you design a tag rugby kit or bib?

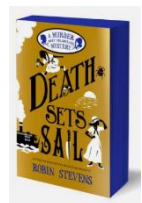
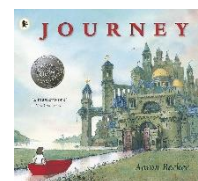


Music
