

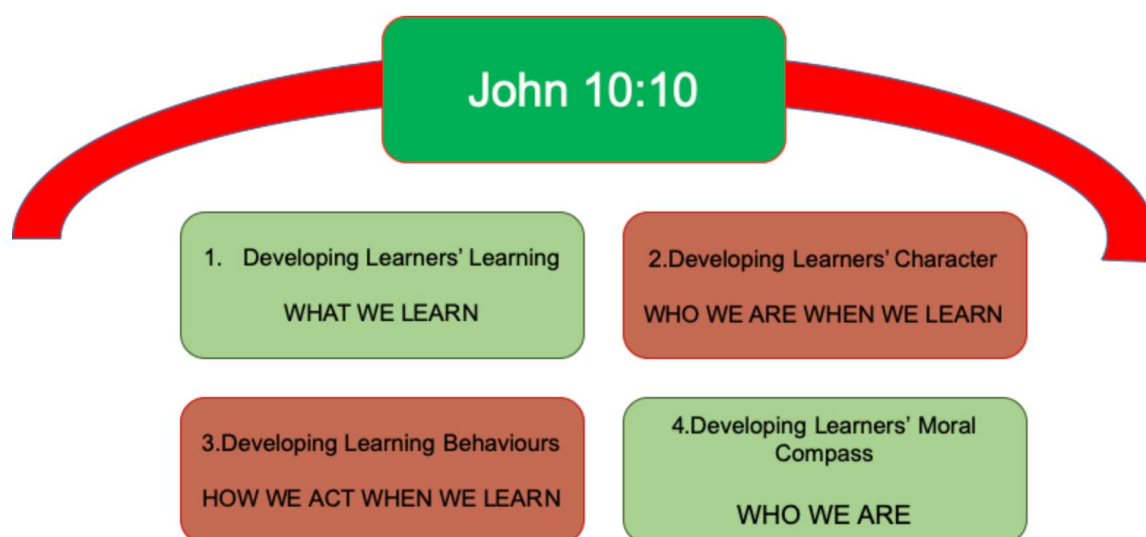


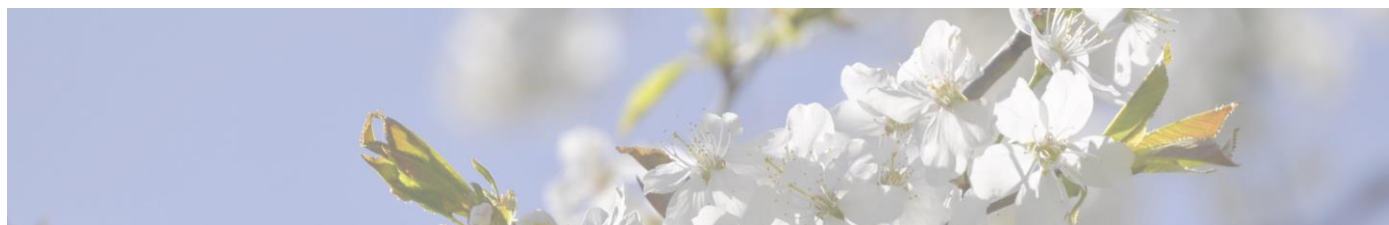
## What is my child learning this half term?

<b>Autumn 2</b>	<b>Year 1/2</b>
<b>Class Novel</b>	Kingfishers: Dave the Pigeon Starlings: Grimwood Swallows: Flat Stanley
<b>Reading and Writing</b>	In Read, Write Inc this half term the children will continue to learn their set 1, 2 and 3 sounds. They will then apply their knowledge when looking at a range of texts including fiction and nonfiction. The children will explore the texts through guided reading exercises, partner practice and creative/informative writing.  Children who have moved onto English lessons with Mrs Eversfield and Mrs Faulkner will be writing poems based on Michael Rosen's Bathroom Fiddler. Later this half term, they will be writing narratives based on Stardust.
<b>Maths</b>	Our Maths focus for this half term is addition and subtraction. Year 1 children will be adding and subtracting numbers to 10 and then 20. Year 2 children will be learning to add and subtract two digit numbers using equipment such as tens and ones (dienes), number lines and place value charts.
<b>Science</b>	This half term in science we will be finding out to keep ourselves healthy and lead healthy lives. This includes looking after our teeth, exercising and eating healthily. We can't wait to make a delicious healthy meal!
<b>RE</b>	In RE this term we will be exploring the question 'who is Muslim and how do they live?'. We will be recognising the words of the Shahadah and why it is very important for Muslims, as well as identifying some of the key Muslim beliefs about God.
<b>History</b>	In history this half term we will be exploring the question: how has transport changed over time? The children will begin to understand primary and secondary resources and learn about one of the great inventors; Isambard Kingdom Brunel. By the end of our topic the children will get the opportunity to create their own model of a vehicle inspired by everything they have learnt about transport – past, present and future!
<b>PE</b>	In PE this term we will be developing our ball skills in basketball and exploring a range of balances and different ways to move our bodies in gymnastics.
<b>RHE</b>	Our focus in relationships and health education this term is safe relationships, exploring how to be a good friend through showing compassion, including others and safe play.
<b>Forest School</b>	In forest school, we will be continuing to learn about seasonal changes. We will be making pumpkin soup, doing leaf rubbings, making popcorn and pressing leaves to create art works inspired by the natural world.

<b>Music</b>	This half term, we will be exploring tempo and dynamics, helping children develop their understanding of the speed and volume of music through engaging activities.
<b>DT</b>	This half term, our DT focus will be on food. We will be taste testing a selection of vegetables and then designing our own festive sandwiches. We will then make these and enjoy them during our Christmas celebrations.
<b>Computing</b>	This half term, we will be introducing algorithms to our classes. This is where you program a set of instructions to complete a simple task. We will be using BeeBots as well as apps on the ipads to program simple algorithms to move from one location to another.
