This thoughtful contribution will directly support the development and well-being of our students with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), enabling us to create an enriching environment that nurtures all aspects of their growth.

Our school vision for the past 3 years has been to raise money to develop the sensory offer for our pupils. This money will enable one of our dreams to become a reality and we have purchased a Sensory Street Pathway which is designed to meet the unique needs of children who benefit from sensory adaptations in their school day. It will offer a safe, inviting, and structured space where students can engage in activities that support both vestibular (balance) and proprioceptive (body awareness) systems. These areas of development are crucial for children who may struggle with sensory processing issues, as they can improve self-regulation, focus, and overall motor skills. With this new pathway, we'll be able to offer experiences that positively impact the children's ability to engage and succeed in the classroom.

Thanks to the generosity of Dartington Village Stores, our students will now have access these important to sensory resources throughout the school day. This pathway will not only enhance the learning environment but also provide our



SEND children with the tools they need to feel secure, focused, and ready to learn. We look forward to this being fitted over the Christmas break!
