
## Letter from Mrs Huish and Mrs Eversfield 24.1.25

Dear Families.

Happy new year! As we move into 2025, our focus value for this half term is Peace. During our assemblies and collective worship this term we will be exploring the different strands of peace and learning how we can find inner peace with ourselves and how that helps us to achieve harmony with others. As part of this, we are discussing how non-religious, spiritual prayer can help us to connect with a deeper part of ourselves and acknowledge the beauty and complexity of the world around us. With our spiritual lens of 'In, Out, Up', we will reflect how this makes us feel (In), how this can impact our relationships with our friends and family (Out) and how this can impact on our whole school community (Up).

She will be working alongside Mrs Palmer as part of the Forest School team as well as teaching curriculum lessons across the school. She is a fully qualified teacher who has chosen to take on an HLTA role due to her passion in building relationships with all children across the school. We are looking forward to her joining the team in due course.

#### **Removing Barriers:** Sustainable Living

As a school, we are deeply committed to sustainable living. We have also been approached by a number of families, recently, who are feeling the impact of the cost-of-living crisis and are struggling to provide shoes and coats for their children. ### **Removing Barriers:** Sentence Builders

At Dartington, we are continuously striving to refine our teaching and learning approach. This year, we have introduced a new strand called 'Sentence Builders'. This is a short ten-minute daily lesson which looks at a discrete grammar skill over a series of lessons. These interactive lessons allow children the time to deepen and embed their knowledge in a variety of ways and supports their understanding of how to build sentences coherently. The impact is already being seen across the school in the confidence that children are showing in their English work. We will be showcasing a sentence builders lesson during our Open Classroom on Thursday 4th February.



### Realise the Possible: School Census Day

Thursday 16th January was the School Census Day. This is a critically important day as it is one of two days where the government calculate our school finding for the next academic year. Funding is calculated based on the numbers of children attending school on that day and the numbers of children in Reception and KS1 who have a school dinner. Attendance on these days is critical as we do not get funding for any child who does not attend school on that day. School Attendance on that day was 96.4% for the whole school and 90% in Reception and Key Stage One. This means that unfortunately we have missed out on 10% of the funding we could have been awarded. Sadly, this equates to £4500 of funding that we could have received.

#### **Sense of Belonging:** Girls Football

In the Autmn term, a parent suggested to us that it might be a good idea to have a time and space separate for girls to play football. They told us that their child, as well as some of their friends, had communicated that they did not feel comfortable in playing football alongside the boys at lunch time. We then spent time speaking to as many children as we could to gage their opinions. What we heard was that boys loved playing football in the mugga and did so frequently. The girls, however, told us that they did not like to play alongside the boys as they did not like the fast-paced games. Having listened to this feedback, we held our first girls football session on Wednesday lunch time. Feedback from the children following this was very positive and we will now make this a weekly event on a Wednesday. Moving forward, we have asked all children to tell us what they would like to do in the mugga on a Monday. There will be a suggestion box for all children to share their views.
